THE COASTAL WAY

(allow 3-4 days)

Port Broughton

Port Broughton is a fishing mecca and a perfect family getaway. The vibrant Tourist Park has its own water slides!

Wallaroo

Relax on spacious beaches, cast a line from the famous jetty and enjoy a local beverage and dining experience.

Moonta and Moonta Bay

Immerse in the Cornish culture of Moonta – then take the kids to Moonta Bay for Splash Town Water Park.

Marion Bay

Marion Bay is the gateway to stunning Dhilba Guuranda-Innes National Park with its surf breaks, rock pools, wild scenery and Inneston township.

Port Vincent

Port Vincent offers a sheltered bay, golden beach and the perfect place to enjoy fish and chips. The nearby marina has first-class boating facilities.

Ardrossan

Home of Blue Swimmer crabs, awesome jetty fishing and imposing red cliffs. The museum pays tribute to the revolutionary Stump Jump Plough.

Port Wakefield

Stroll the historic wharf and the mangrove boardwalks. The family-friendly Rising Sun Hotel is great for a feed after a dip in the swimming area.

THE INLAND DRIVE

(allow 2-3 days)

Kadina

Head to the Victoria Square playground, explore the Apex Express or get adventurous in the Treetop Playground. The Farm Shed has an indoor play centre for kids with mini golf and miniature train.

Arthurton

Stop for a break at Sunny Hill Distillery on a farm north of Arthurton. This 'crop to drop' producer offers awardwinning gin, vodka and whisky — as well as scenic views to the coast.

Minlaton

Minlaton is home to a fine bakery, gallery, the Watsacowie Brewery, Minlagawi Gum Flat Reserve, and Harry Butler's *Red Devil* Bristol monoplane.

Yorketown

Follow the Yorke Peninsula Salt Lake Trail to discover over 200 salt lakes surrounding Yorketown. Kids love the town's Weaners Flat playground, walking trail, garden, colourful murals and piping hot donuts! Look for the signs.

Warooka

Warooka is the gateway to the peninsula's dramatic 'foot'. Attractions include historic Ballara Retreat with immersive art workshops, gallery and a museum housed in the old police station. Fresh seafood can be purchased at Lower Yorke Seafood.

(allow 4-5 days)

Bond Store, Wallaroo

An exciting microbrewery, distillery and restaurant, Bond Store Wallaroo is a relaxed venue located on Owen Terrace.

Emoyeni Wines, Ardrossan

Emoyeni Wines is a family-run boutique winery welcoming pets and families to its tasting shed.

Oysters, Stansbury

Book your outing as 'Deckie for a Day' with Pacific Estate Oysters. Grab yourself some locally-grown oysters at Southern Yorke Oysters.

Alpacas, Minlaton and Wool Bay

Alpacas Chaparral farm (and outlet) offers tours by appointment. Barachel Alpacas also welcomes visitors to their farm and outlet. Both usually have baby alpacas!

Watsacowie Brewing Co., Minlaton

Sample craft beers, live music and great food in this buzzy brewery. Watsacowie has quickly established itself as a Yorkes favourite.

Barley Stacks Wines, Maitland

Enjoy free tastings of Barley Stacks' huge range of wines. Surrounded by some of Yorke's richest farmland, their shed is classic rustic chic.

Sunny Hill Distillery, Arthurton

Sunny Hill Distillery offers vodka, whisky and gin made from the grain grown on the farm. The cellar door is very cool!

HISTORY, ART

(allow 4-5 days)

Port Broughton

Follow the story of this onceimportant trading port on three self-guided trails. Leaflets available from the Visitor Information Outlet.

Wallaroo

Stroll the Wallaroo Town Walking Trail, visit the Heritage Museum to see 'George The Giant Squid' and stay for the nightly Silo Light Show best viewed from Jetty Road.

Moonta Mines

Moonta Mines is a National Heritage site. Be sure to visit the museum and ride the tourist railway on a 50-minute guided tour of the site.

Port Victoria

Divers can explore the eight shipwrecks which form the Wardang Island Maritime Heritage Trail. Don't miss the brilliant jetty museum telling the story of the mighty Grain Racers.

Minlaton

Harvest Corner has fantastic local artworks, handmade craft and foods. Harry Butler's *Red Devil* Bristol monoplane is on display in a special memorial to Butler's pioneering flights in 1919.

Edithburgh

Explore Edithburgh's Mosaic Trail with 94 mosaics placed along the 2.9 kilometre trail. Visit the museum to find out about the *Clan Ranald* shipwreck.

Gallery 1871, Port Broughton

Gallery 1871 is a curated art space for ongoing exhibitions and workshops.

Ascot Art Gallery, Kadina

Ascot Art Gallery has monthly exhibitions and the Kernewek Lowender Art Prize collection.

Salty Art Studio, Moonta Bay

A wide range of artworks made from beachcombing finds. Expect works fashioned from driftwood, ghost rope and gorgeous salt-rusted metal.

Harvest Corner Gallery, Minlaton

This gallery showcases acclaimed local artists including Allyson Parsons, Mark Short and Marie Parsons

SYP Mural Trail

Discover the colourful water towers and tanks by following the 62-kilometre self-drive trail from Port Vincent to Stansbury, then onto Yorketown, before heading back to the coast to Edithburgh and Coobowie.

Ballara Art & Lifestyle Retreat, Warooka

As well as art and photography exhibitions, Ballara has workshops for all ages.

Studio Surf, Marion Bay

Inspired by its spectacular surrounds, Studio Surf features work by owner/artist Jason Swales and other local talents. Cakes and coffee also for sale.



SALT LAKE TRAIL

(allow 15 minutes-2 hours)

Yorketown

The Salt Lake Trail offers four self-drive options. All begin and end at Weaners Flat Reserve. Surrounded by some 200 salt lakes, Yorketown started as a centre of commercial salt harvesting — a history as captivating as the shades of pink colours that Instagrammers are crazy for!

Full Drive: about two hours

This driving route takes you past some of the best and most accessible salt lakes on Southern Yorkes. Interpretative signage highlights the history of salt production at Lake Fowler, Dhalliwanggu (Lake Sunday) and Pink Lake.

Short Drive: about 15 minutes

A quick but satisfying tour of the best salt lakes surrounding Yorketown, this drive goes via Domaschenz Lake, Geitz Lake and Pink Lake.

School Ruins and Cemeteries Tour: about an hour

A self-guided drive that takes in school ruins at Dhalliwanggu (Lake Sunday) and Sunbury, before heading to the Lake Fowler school site. This drive also stops at the Pink Lake Cemetery overlooking one of the best salt lakes.

Lake Fowler Drive: about an hour

Found on the way to Edithburgh, Lake Fowler is one of the largest salt lakes. When full, it covers an area of 780ha. At the peak of the commercial salt industry on Southern Yorkes it was the largest salt scraping operation.

ADVENTURE TRAIL

(various)

Walk the Yorke

One of Australia's finest trails offers 500 kilometres of walking and bike trails around the entire peninsula. Think little-seen beaches, stunning farm scenery and wild cliffs.

Wreck diving off Wardang Island

The Wardang Island Maritime Heritage Trail offers eight amazing dive sites, including the wrecks of schooners and coastal steamers from the early 1900s.

Snorkelling off Edithburgh

The pylons of Edithburgh jetty make for super easy snorkelling. Species include Big-bellied seahorses, Port Jackson sharks, Leafy seadragons and cuttlefish.

Troubridge Island

Rent your own island and stay in the lighthouse keeper's cottage on Troubridge Island — a far-flung adventure for the wild at heart.

Fishing charters

You'll find fishing charters up and down the peninsula, many offering a variety of tours to meet your needs.

Marion Bay Ocean Safari

Head into pristine waters off Pondalowie Bay in Dhilba Guuranda-Innes National Park. Expect to see dolphins, seals, bird life and whales (in season).

Surfing

The southern end of Yorkes is home to legendary surfing spots, including Chinamans and Trespassers. Daly Head is a world-class surfing reserve.

Playgrounds galore

For family fun, be sure to let the kids loose on **Yorketown's Weaners Flat Reserve**. Take a walk around the salt lake and then let the kids swing and climb in the modern playground.

Port Broughton's foreshore recreation area has an all-abilities access playground along with a basketball court and gym equipment overlooking the foreshore and is a short walk from the jetty and main street.

If you want a playground with a view, head to the east coast where **Ardrossan**, **Stansbury** and **Port Vincent** have their facilities right on the foreshore. What could be better than enjoying some fish and chips or ice cream and watching the world go by while the kids have a ball?

Point Turton's nature playground is a must-see during your visit. The kids can get back to nature on the foreshore walkway, not far from here.

You'll be spoiled for choice with playgrounds up north. Wallaroo, North Beach, Port Hughes, Moonta Bay and Kadina are close enough to each other to undertake a playground marathon! Some of these are on the foreshore, perfect for a cooling dip. You can also cool off at Splash Town Water Park in Moonta Bay.

Copper Trails Bike Hire, Moonta

Explore on two wheels

Pack the bikes, boards and scooters, and head to one of the skate parks and bike tracks around the region. For the younger ones, there's a learn-to-ride track in Moonta. Wallaroo, Port Broughton, Minlaton and Moonta all have fantastic skate parks, catering for a range of ages and skill levels.

Whether you set up camp to the north or to the south, there's a pump track to suit at **Corny Point** and **Port Broughton**. In the centre, you may want to check out the **Maitland BMX track**.

CRABBING TIPS

Blue Swimmer crabs are best caught during summer. Try your luck along the beaches from Port Gawler to Stansbury in Gulf St Vincent or along the Spencer Gulf to Port Broughton.

- It's easy! All you need is a tub and a rake (available for about \$10 in most local shops). Don't forget to wear old sneakers a crab will go for your toes!
- The best time to head out is when the tide turns to come hack in
- Rake where the soft sand meets the weed. When a crab grabs your rake, lift it into your tub!
- The best months for crabbing are September to April as the waters are warmer and more productive.
- Be mindful that crabs have a legal size and bag limit, and that females carrying eggs (roe) can't be taken.



Jetty fishing

Thanks to a history of wheat exporting, Yorke's coastline has some spectacular timber jetties. Expect plenty of locals and visitors casting for tommies, jigging for squid and dropping pots for crabs.

Boat owners

Boat owners will find plenty of good boat ramps and beach launching facilities - many with all-weather ramps. When in doubt, ask around for the heads-up on local conditions. Many have fish cleaning and wash down facilities, and most ramps have dual lanes.

What's out there?

Australian salmon Found anywhere there is a headland, bluff or surf area, Australian salmon can be caught all year-around using pilchards or lures for bait. The best seasons are autumn and winter.

Blue Swimmer crab Crabs can be caught all year-round but you'll have the best luck in the warmer months. The best baits to use are fish heads and squid, or grab a rake, plastic tub and old sneakers and head off the beach.

King George whiting Succulent King George whiting can be caught from both sides of the peninsula and they are undoubtedly one of the tastiest meals you will catch from the sea.

Southern Rock lobster Rugged coastline areas on the southern shores of Yorke Peninsula are home to Southern Rock lobster. These delicious crustaceans are permitted to be caught in the open season.

Squid Squid can be caught pretty much anywhere around the coastline – from jetties or boats. Watch out for the ink while you score yourself a tasty meal!

Garfish Gar are plentiful in the warmer months and inhabit all the waters around Yorke Peninsula. Gents, prawns and cockles are their bait of choice.

Tommy Ruffs A great option for the kids, "tommies" or Australian Herring, are one of the easiest species to catch from any of the many jetties.

Windara Reef

The first of its kind in South Australia and the largest in Australia, Windara Reef is a shellfish restoration reef located in Gulf St Vincent. It offers great fishing for recreational fishers with fish species including King George whiting. The 20-hectare reef site located off Rogues Point, south of Ardrossan, focuses on habitat restoration, specifically the restoration of native shellfish reefs which have been lost from the Yorke Peninsula region.

No boat? No worries!

If you're looking for an unforgettable experience and guidance from a local expert, why not book a fishing charter? Whether you're a novice or experienced, the crew are always happy to help you hook into some great action at their best fishing grounds.

Most charter operators can cater for small to large groups or you can join in with another group if travelling solo. Target species include a range of wild fish from nannygai and morwong to harlequin, trevally, kingfish, tuna and mulloway. Reef Encounters Fishing Charters are based at Marion Bay to guide you around the wild south. Deckie for a Day lets you get up close and personal with oysters at Stansbury.

Wide open spaces

Yorke Peninsula is not only beautiful, much of it is protected.

The leg of land is surrounded by more than 700 kilometres of coastline and no fewer than four of South Australia's 19 marine parks. The beaches are pristine and for the greatest part, empty of people. As for the land itself, the open spaces are vast and great tracts of it are still under native bushland.

Wildlife flourishes in the paddocks and the national park. Expect to see kangaroos and emus across the region. Look out for the hefty Shingleback lizards and an occasional echidna on the straw-coloured dirt roads that criss-cross the barley fields. And if you want to see rarer native species, head to

the new conservation program underway in spectacular Dhilba Guuranda-Innes National Park, where Tammar Wallabies and Brush-Tailed Bettongs have been released as part of the Marna Banggara conservation project. Southern Brown Bandicoots, Red-Tailed Phascogales and Western Quolls are also scheduled to be introduced.

The birdlife is as prolific as it is surprising. The pelicans are fearless, always happy to sit in wait while the fishermen fillet their catch. The White-bellied sea eagles take a little more patience to find, but one of the most fancied birds - the wild budgerigars of Port Vincent are surprisingly easy to spot.

On the many clifftop walks, you're very likely to spot eagle rays, some of them two metres across. Dolphins will put on a show most months of the year, right around the peninsula, so too will the seals, and in the more southerly waters, Southern Right Whales can be seen from May to September.

Stay and explore

Seven renovated heritage lodges within the Inneston historic township make the perfect base for exploring Dhilba Guuranda-Innes National Park. Step into the past and experience the uninhabited village which once provided facilities and housing for 200 gypsum miners and families. A stroll along the Inneston Historic Walk is a great way to explore this special part of the state's mining history.

Shipwrecks, lighthouses and walking trails

A must do is a visit to the Ethel wreck. The bones of this iron barque have rested on the beach since 1904. Steps now offer easy beach access. Located on the same beach is the boiler of the steamer, Ferret. For breathtaking 360 degree views of the mainland and ocean, take a walk along the West Cape Headland, passing the West Cape Lighthouse.

Diving made easy

Snorkellers can get a taste of the water clarity and marine diversity around the pylons of Edithburgh Jetty, where keen-eyed naturalists have been known to spot the fabled Leafy seadragon and the always-fascinating cuttlefish. Point Gilbert near Port Moorowie offers shallow snorkelling and the chance to see Port Jackson sharks.

Camping

Dhilba Guuranda-Innes National Park has seven designated campgrounds, mostly within easy reach from your next surf or beach adventure. Pondalowie Bay Campground (known as Pondie to the locals) has public toilets, gas barbecues and up to 50 campsites. There are areas for caravans, motor homes and trailers (no campfire facilities). Shell Beach, Casuarina or Cable Bay campgrounds provide the next level of isolation. Please note that campfires are not permitted in Dhilba Guuranda-Innes National Park during fire danger season.

Southern Spencer Gulf Marine Park

Encompassing the coastline of the Park, the Southern Spencer Gulf Marine Park is home to pods of dolphins all year-round, while schools of Southern Right Whales cruise past from May to September.

If you want to be on the waters and aren't fussed about fishing, try Marion Bay Ocean Safari who offer cruise experiences out of stunning Pondalowie Bay. For complete relaxation, SA Eco Tours offer a guided package of the wild south.

Troubridge Island

Troubridge Island Conservation Park is six kilometres off the coast from Edithburgh. This unique sand island is an important breeding area for birds. Only accessible by boat and with a permit, once you've reached this peaceful island, take in its beauty by fishing or swimming along the white sandy beaches. Hide away for a few nights in the original lighthouse keeper's cottage. The Heritage-listed cottage accommodation has all the modern conveniences you need for an idyllic escape from city life.

Adelaide International Bird Sanctuary

The Adelaide International Bird Sanctuary National Park - Winaityinaityi Pangkara helps protect resident and migratory shorebirds along the coast of Gulf St Vincent. It covers a 60 kilometre stretch of coast from the Barker Inlet to Port Parham, including sections of the Adelaide Dolphin Sanctuary.

Each summer, the mudflats, mangroves and saltmarshes support an estimated 27,000 shorebirds, including many listed as threatened species.

Walk the Yorke

Walk the Yorke is a 500-kilometre shared trail for walking and cycling. Meander along a section or tackle the whole coastline (auided or self-auided) – the choice is yours. The trail links existing coastal trails and showcases the spectacular coastline, diverse coastal communities and environments unique to Yorke Peninsula. Take a casual stroll or ramp things up for multi-day walks. Highlights include:

The Mangrove Meander Explore the unique samphire flats and mangroves, from Port Clinton to Price.

The Red Cliff Wonder The spectacular red cliffs between Tiddy Widdy Beach and Ardrossan are extra special at sunrise

Get Arty Discover the sea-themed mosaic walk between Edithburgh and Sultana Point.

Bush and Birds Visit the bush garden at Port Moorowie and watch the fantastic birdlife and other wildlife in Dhilba Guuranda-Innes National Park; take as two separate trips or one long one.

Walk the North

Moonta Mines Walking Trails Delve into the history of this copper mining area via three marked trails: Rvans Walk, Hancocks Walk and Hughes Walk.

Port Broughton Historic Walking Trail Follow the trail booklet available along historic landmarks to soak up Port Broughton's history.

Port Hughes Coastal Trail From Simms Cove to South Beach, 10 signs tell the history of Port Hughes along this 2.5 kilometre trail.

Copper Rail Trail An eight kilometre sealed shared cycling and walking trail, the Copper Rail Trail follows the old railway line between Wallaroo and Kadina. Allow around 30 minutes to ride (one way) and two hours walking.

Smelters Trail, Wallaroo A short walk with interpretive signage outlining Wallaroo's early smelting history, this walk follows sealed

paths along the foreshore and past historic Hughes Chimney Stack.

Snook Road Nature Walk, Fisherman Bay

This trail through pristine natural environment has abundant native birds, including the Great Egret, White-bellied Sea Eagle and Rainbow Bee-eater. The area is also a critical habitat for marine life, with mangroves providing a nursery for prawns and other species.

Stroll the South

Dhilba Guuranda-Innes National Park

Walking Trails The park has several excellent walking trails ranging from short loops to halfday hikes, and plenty of opportunities to see birds and wildlife

Minlaton Walking Trail Heading to the fauna reserve before meandering through the outskirts of town, this six kilometre walk includes interpretive signs about the river red aums.

Barkers Rocks Walking Trail This five kilometre trail between Barkers Rocks and Port Rickaby features a pristine reserve with great coastal views.

Port Victoria Geology Trail Highlighting volcanic action from nearly 2000 million years ago, this is an interesting and easy three kilometre walk.

Port Vincent Walking Trail This trail runs through native scrub on the northern boundary of Port Vincent, with entry north of the marina.

Stansbury Coastal Trail This walk follows the foreshore around to the back beach where

you can see various birdlife, then choose a cliff top or beach walk to Pitts Cutting.

Run the parks

Park Runs have grown in popularity around the state, and Yorke Peninsula is no different. The free, fun and friendly community events are open to all - walk, jog, run, volunteer or spectate, it's up to you. All runs are held on Saturdays at 8am. Local locations to check out are:

Edithburgh The run takes place at Edithburgh Tidal Pool, Corner O'Halloran Parade and Giles Terrace. Edithburgh.

Port Broughton The event begins at the beautiful Port Broughton foreshore, West Terrace.

Copper Trail Get your shoes on and head to the Copper Trail, 203 Racecourse Road, Kadina.

The Port Hughes foreshore area has a general store, tavern, playground, grassed barbecue areas and public parking.

When the weather turns cooler, long walks along the beach or waiting for one of the spectacular Spencer Gulf sunsets is the perfect way to finish your day.



Moonta Mines

The rich copper deposit beneath Moonta Mines helped bankroll South Australia and brought Cornish culture to the other side of the world. Board the famous Tourist Railway to see the dramatic mine site and hear tales of life, loss and the remarkable legacy of Moonta. (Know why a Cornish pastie has a thick crust on the top? Prepare to be amazed!)



Wallaroo Heritage and **Nautical Museum**

The 1877 Tiparra lighthouse is placed out front, but there's plenty to see inside the Wallaroo Heritage and Nautical Museum as well. Housed in the town's first post office, there is extensive local history of mining, farming and lifestyle. Also featured is 'George the Giant Squid', a deep ocean-dwelling squid, obtained from the stomach of a whale in 1980 and is now preserved and on display. George is a favourite with the kids!



Copper Coast Putt Putt

Copper Coast Putt Putt is an 18-hole mini golf course located in the grounds out the front of the Copper Coast Visitor Information Centre at 50 Mines Road, Kadina. Allow about an hour to play a round at this fun course as part of your visit to the centre. On selected days, the miniature train offers rides around the complex.




Port Broughton



Be sure to allow time for a drive to Port Broughton for a pub dinner and to watch the sun setting over Spencer Gulf. The illuminated silo art in Wallaroo is a must-see.



ΚΔΡΙΝΔ

Kadina is the largest town on Yorke Peninsula and is the unofficial capital of 'Australia's Little Cornwall'. In its mining heyday in the late 19th century, Kadina had a population of 20,000 people. Today it's home to around 4500 people. Kernewek Lowender, the biennial Cornish Festival, is held in Moonta, Wallaroo and Kadina. The next event is 2023.

Families like to head to Victoria Square Park, which has large shady trees and radical Treetops Playground. Kadina is also home to an indoor play centre, miniature train and puttputt course at the visitor centre. If you're with older children, why not hire a bike to explore Kadina's historic township or walking trails? There is an 18-hole golf course with clubhouse and a range of cafés, restaurants and hotels.



MOONTA

Moonta's origins in 1860 were based in copper mining. The ensuing flood of skilled miners from Cornwall changed the state's cultural mix and as a celebration of Cornish heritage, Moonta

takes part in the biennial Kernewek Lowender festival, along with Kadina and Wallaroo.

There are many beautiful historic buildings in town, including the Moonta Mines Museum in the Moonta Mines Model School. Built around 1878, the museum is worth a visit. It's also the place to board the tourist train which takes you around the heritage areas. You can enjoy a stroll along the main street where you'll find a variety of shops from antiques to giftware. Café Capella's and Taste the Yorke, are especially popular for their fine foods.

Moonta, along with Moonta Bay and Port Hughes, took the title of 2021 SA Top Tourism Town winner.



MOONTA BAY

The sandy coves, stunning beaches, jetty and clear blue waters complete the idyllic panorama of Moonta Bay. It's also one of the best places on the peninsula to watch the sunset from the beach. Stay in one of the wide range of beachfront accommodation available, including a caravan park, motels and a variety of self-contained holiday homes. Port Julia



Port Victoria

Port Victoria is located on the western coastline of Yorke Peninsula and has a wealth of maritime heritage for history lovers to explore. Port Victoria is known as the last of the windjammer ports. For over 70 years grain was loaded onto ships bound for Europe via Cape Horn. Port Victoria was once the fourth largest port in South Australia, and was one of the last Australian ports to see the large square-rigged sailing vessels operate on a commercial basis. This story is brilliantly told in the Port Victoria Maritime Museum.



Barley Stacks Wines

Barley Stacks was the first commercial vineyard and winery to be established on the traditional barley belt of Yorke Peninsula. A short drive south from the historic town of Maitland, the wine produced at Barley Stacks Wines is made from the grapes grown in their own vineyards, which are crushed, fermented, stored and bottled on-site. The vines were planted in 1996 and include Shiraz, Cabernet Sauvignon, Chardonnay and Viognier. The Barley Stacks Wines Cellar Door and Function Centre is open seven days a week. Tasting experiences, as well as pizzas and cheese platters are available, and events are held throughout the year.



Port Victoria

Walk the Yorke -Port Victoria to Balgowan

One of the shorter sections at a distance of 21.3 kilometres, this should take around five and a half hours. Off the coastline of Port Victoria is Wardang Island, which covers an area of around 2025 hectares. Just to the north of Port Victoria, the trail goes inland through the Nharangga Aboriginal Lands and Point Pearce. The trail continues north to Balgowan, once a shipping port and now a coastal holiday retreat. Take time to admire the spectacular cliffs, especially worth a look at sunset.



Ardrossan Lookout

Located approximately five kilometres south of Ardrossan, the Ardrossan Lookout is a great spot for a fantastic sunrise photo over the gulf. From the lookout you can view the dolomite mine to the west and Gulf St Vincent and Adelaide to the east. Or head to the coastal side of town, where the imposing red cliffs provide amazing photo opportunities.



Parara

Bush camping

Central Yorke Peninsula is home to some truly beautiful bush camping spots. Set up and enjoy the scenic ocean views at either Parara, The Gap, The Bamboos, Tiparra Rocks or Wauraltee Beach. Check each bush camping location for facilities and number of sites. which are first come-first served. Fees vary with permits available for a night, week, month or year.



Stump Jump Plough

Ardrossan Museum

This is some of the best barley producing country in the world. The early settlers helped ease the early backbreaking work of clearing mallee stumps to create cropping land using the Stump Jump Plough - the history of which can be found in the Ardrossan Museum, The plough. the rich limestone soils and the dedication of local growers resulted in the production of bumper crops.

Ardrossan

SUNRISE TO SUNSET

Start the day at Ardrossan after spending the night at one of the accommodation options in town, and head to the town's lookout for great views of the sunrise across the gulf.

Check out Emoyeni Wines before heading across to Maitland at your leisure and time your journey to take in the local markets. Admire the giant bronze Clydesdale horse sculpture in the centre of town and settle in to a local pub for some country hospitality.

Spend a night at Peg's Place Farm Stay and watch the sunset over the jetty at Port Victoria, stretch your legs on the beach and take in the interpretive signage of the many shipwrecks of the coast.



Maitland

CENTRAL

The centre of Yorke Peninsula is renowned for its prime cropping land, providing bumper crops of barley, wheat, beans, and lentils. Depending on the time of year, you will see farmers sowing their crops or bringing in the harvest with their massive machinery. In summer, be sure to look out for Shinglebacks, or 'sleepy lizards'. Spend a day cruising the backroads and look for photo opportunities. When the canola is flowering, the brilliant yellow makes for an amazing roadside backdrop. Head to Barley Stacks Wines, south of Maitland, for a spot of wine tasting, made from local grapes. The vines were planted in 1996 and produce Shiraz, Cabernet Sauvignon, Chardonnay and Viognier.




Black Point

BEACH IT UP

Start your day at Black Point. This north-facing beach is renowned for its beauty and convenience from Adelaide. With such spectacular views, and the appearance of a coffee van to meet your caffeine needs, you may find it hard to tear yourself away. Head north to Ardrossan and stroll the streets.

A centre for the surrounding areas, Ardrossan has some great shops to discover. You may want to hit the bakery for some of their famous produce and then stroll the jetty where views of the silos to the south are impressive. Any luck and there will be huge ships anchored in the bay, ready to take on loads of dolomite. End the day in one of the country pubs for a hearty country meal.

TOWNS OF CENTRAL YORKE PENINSULA



ARDROSSAN

Ardrossan is a main agricultural centre for the surrounding districts which are a rich wheat and barley growing area. Bulk grain handling facilities and a sea port allow easy exportation of produce and the silos can be seen from kilometres away. Ships can often be seen in the bay, awaiting loading. There is a dolomite operation just south of the town (offering a great lookout) and Cheetham Salt harvests salt north of Ardrossan, near Price.

Ardrossan is a well serviced town offering good shopping and facilities with a supermarket, hardware stores, clothing and general

shopping. Ardrossan also has two hotels, takeaway food, a bakery, cafés and fuel outlets. Head to local boutique winery Emoyeni Wines on their open days for tastings and sales.

Ardrossan is home to the delicious Blue Swimmer crab, a delicacy that can easily be caught and enjoyed in the warmer months using nets from the jetty or by raking the shallows at low tide – you can do this either north or south of the town. Don't forget to wear shoes, as those claws are sharp!

The jetty is usually a hive of activity with anglers casting lines for tommies, mullet, garfish, crabs and squid. There is a small, protected boat harbour with pontoon boarding and all tide access, providing useful facilities for any visiting angler.

Scan the QR codes to access town maps

Take the opportunity to see a piece of South Australian history at the local museum. Designed and manufactured locally, the historic agricultural implement, the Stump Jump Plough, made it possible to farm the world's finest barley nearby. The museum is the site of the original factory of inventor, CH Smith.

Stroll along the scenic cliff top trail from Ardrossan to Tiddy Widdy Beach. With great views of Gulf St Vincent and plenty of birdlife, this easy three-kilometre trail is both cycle and wheelchair-friendly and forms part of the Walk the Yorke trail.

Out at sea, the wreck of the *Zanoni* lies 10 nautical miles from shore. A diving permit is required to dive on this historic wreck. The Windara Reef is seven kilometres off the coast. It is the first shellfish restoration reef of its kind in South Australia and has been designed to contribute to a healthier marine environment and improved opportunities for recreational fishers.

The National Trust Museum and Information Centre provide an insight into local history and the natural attractions of the area. The Ardrossan Caravan Park is ideally located with easy access to the town centre, jetty, beach, golf course and boat ramp. Facilities include villas, cabins, ensuite powered sites, powered and unpowered sites, fish cleaning, crab cooking, laundry and playgrounds.



ARTHURTON

A small town in the centre of the peninsula, Arthurton is surrounded by farmland with some of Australia's richest crop-producing soils. Sunny Hill Distillery is located just to the north of the town, producing vodka and gin from locally grown grain.



BLACK POINT

Black Point offers a beach with no rips, making it a popular destination for families and holiday makers. It provides absolute beachfront accommodation with plenty of options available from a basic beach shack to luxury self-contained holiday homes. There is also a small caravan park located on the cliff top overlooking the bay.

There are several beach access points, and a boat ramp. Swimming, fishing, crabbing, sailing and water skiing are among the most popular aquatic activities. With no roads in between the front row and the water, the only thing between you and the ocean is the white sandy beach.

Once a 19th century quarantine station, Black Point is now one of the most prized stretches of real estate in South Australia. With around 150 'shacks' lining the beautiful, white crescent beach, many buildings are more elaborate than the average family home, as are some of the boats. Black Point is sometimes portrayed as a playground of the elite, but it's open for everyone to enjoy.

Take advantage of the Walk the Yorke trail and meander along the cliff tops. If you're lucky you might spot Wilfred the Van where you can grab a morning coffee.

Raking for Blue Swimmer crabs is possible here too, look for them when the tide is turning.



MAITLAND

Situated on top of a ridge, overlooking the Yorke Valley, Maitland is geographically the central town on Yorke Peninsula, only a 15-minute drive from both the east and west coasts. Due to higher rainfall than other parts of the Yorke Peninsula, Maitland is surrounded by some of the best barley country in Australia.

Maitland has a historic walking trail that winds its way past heritage buildings and the National Trust Museum. The Maitland Hotel was one of the first buildings, constructed in 1874. Those with an eye for sport and politics will find the town's war memorial interesting. It contains the names of football legends, as well as the father of an Australian Prime Minister.

The Maitland Markets are open weekly – centrally located, the markets have plenty of room to park the caravan. Look out for the bronze sculpture of a Clydesdale, representing a bygone era when farmers were dependent on their horses. Wander in and have a look at the range of interesting goods for sale.

Maitland Information Outlet, located in the Heart of Maitland complex, can provide information on the local area as well as maps and brochures. The town has a great bakery and café for your food and coffee needs.

A little over 13 kilometres south of Maitland on the Spencer Highway is Barley Stacks Wines. Located right in the middle of Yorke Peninsula's barley belt, an area traditionally renowned for growing the world's best malting barley, the vineyard has a strong focus on environmental sustainability. All wine produced at Barley Stacks is made from grapes grown in the vineyards, where it is also crushed, fermented, stored, and bottled right on site. The cellar door is open seven days a week for tastings.



PINE POINT

Pine Point overlooks Port Alfred Bay and with the sweep of Black Point in the distance, was once one of the busiest ports on Yorke Peninsula. Today, it is a popular spot for fishing and raking the shallows for Blue Swimmer crabs.



PORT VICTORIA

Start your visit to Port Victoria at the beautiful (and very long) jetty. At the end of the 19th century the waters were filled with sailing ships of all sizes, their holds bulging with sacks of wheat and barley.

The small Port Victoria Maritime Museum at the start of the jetty showcases the town's history and maritime heritage and is well worth a visit. The Wardang Island Maritime Heritage Trail includes eight shipwrecks located in the nearby waters off Wardang Island. You can explore these and the underwater diving trail is very popular. If you're not a diver, there are also interpretative signs on land. The Port Victoria Jetty was recently repaired after a storm and is back to its former glory, once again popular with swimmers and anglers.

The Port Victoria Geology Trail extends from south of the jetty for around four kilometres to Rifle Butts Beach and showcases the area's volcanic beginnings. Brochures for this trail are available at the local shop. There are also foreshore walking trails, for those who wish to stretch their legs.

Port Victoria has a terrific hotel, takeaway and general store. Nearby Maitland is just 10 minutes drive to the north for all other needs.

Consider experiencing 40,000 years of Aboriginal dreaming, culture and heritage by joining a tour with Aboriginal Cultural Tours SA. This award-winning tour operator has tours of nearby Point Pearce and its Aboriginal lands. It also takes tour groups to Dhilba Guuranda-Innes National Park at the foot of Yorke Peninsula.



As part of the bushfire recovery program, nine artists took up their brushes and spray-guns to enliven five concrete water towers that run 62 kilometres from Port Vincent to Coobowie. The trail is part of the Yorke Peninsula Art Trail featuring scores of murals gracing buildings, sheds and assorted structures along the Peninsula.

EAST SIDE

Head to the foreshore for breakfast at the Port Vincent Kiosk or café. Over your coffee you can marvel at the spectacular curved bay.

Drive to Entrance 45 of Walk the Yorke; here you can traverse the remote beach section for around an hour, taking in the caves and geological formations.

Lunch at the award-winning Dalrymple Hotel in Stansbury for more spectacular sea views and an awesome meal, then head out as 'Deckie for a Day' (dependent on tides) to see the inner workings of an oyster lease - and enjoy some oysters fresh from the sea.

Stretch your legs with a foreshore walk in the evening, admiring the towering pines that line the esplanade.

ARTY INTENTIONS

The Southern Yorke Peninsula Mural Trail is a 60-kilometre self-drive tour that leads you past five incredible murals in different Yorke Peninsula towns - Port Vincent, Stansbury, Coobowie, Edithburgh and Yorketown.

Start at Yorketown's water tower, follow the trail via Stansbury and Port Vincent then back through Coobowie and Edithburgh.

Traverse back through Yorketown and 'over the Peesey', a flat stretch of land that is home to many salt lakes and patches of unique samphire. Baker Bros Art Gallery is well worth a look in the main street of Warooka.

Continue on to Minlaton's Harvest Corner Gallery or south to Studio Surf Gallery in Marion Bay.



Corny Point

THE **BOTTOM END**

Start your day at picturesque Corny Point with a seafront walk on the spectacular coast road to Marion Bay.

Grab some lunch at Marion Bay – order takeaway at the Marion Bay General Store or dine in at the tavern before heading into Dhilba Guuranda-Innes National Park.

Marion Bay General Store

This Marion Bay institution is now serving the beachside essentials out of their new shop think great coffee, hot dogs, hamburgers (with the lot, of course) and hot chips. There's also a changing menu of takeaway pastas and hot roasts, but you need to get in quick!



Point Turton General Store & Bakery

Another evergreen fave, the General Store and Bakery is famous for its freshbaked bread and cakes. You'll also find hot dogs, pies, pasties, fish and potato cakes, as well as all those camping and fishing provisions you suddenly need...





Edithburgh Tidal Pool

TOWNS OF SOUTHERN YORKE PENINSULA



COOBOWIE

Close to Edithburgh, early explorers found Coobowie and the tidal inlet so attractive they started planning a big city here. When fresh water couldn't be found, they felt cheated and named it Deception Bay. Today Coobowie is a popular seaside town with plenty of fishing spots and wide beaches. There is a hotel and playground close to the foreshore and a picturesque five-kilometre coastal walking trail to Edithburgh. Birdwatchers shouldn't miss the Coobowie Bird Hide. There are brochures available locally to help identify the array of birdlife. The Coobowie Caravan Park is a great place to stay with cabins available right on the foreshore.



CORNY POINT

Matthew Flinders named this area Corny Point because it looked like a corn on the foot of Yorke Peninsula. Corny Point is the gateway to the best surfing spots on the west coast; Berry Bay and Formby Bay to name a few. It's a popular place for boat fishing and there are several north-facing swimming beaches which are great for kids. Grab a bite from the shop or tavern and enjoy the untouched outdoors. The 1881 Corny Point lighthouse is the starting point for many adventures — don't forget to stop and take a picture with this local landmark.



EDITHBURGH

Located in the south-eastern corner of Yorke Peninsula and looking out to Troubridge Island, Edithburgh has always been a popular destination for locals as well as visitors.

Overlooked by the Wattle Point wind farm, the town has hotels, motels, a caravan park, coastal golf course and parklands laid out to the same design as those in Adelaide by Colonel William Light. The park lands have recently become the site for well attended Park Runs, so if you are in the area, feel free to take part.

There isn't much need for swimming pools near the beach but Edithburgh has one and the tidal saltwater pool is a hit in summer. If you are visiting, it's not to be missed. Edithburgh is an excellent spot for anglers with mullet, yellowfin, whiting and larger fish all popular catches. Fishing can be done from the jetty, boat or beach, and boat launching is made easy with twin boat ramps and floating pontoons.

Known for its spectacular diving and snorkelling, the jetty has a variety of marine life, from Leafy seadragons to Big-bellied seahorses, Port Jackson sharks, cuttlefish and a range of fish and corals.

At the museum, learn about the large salt industry that once dominated the town and discover the historic *Clan Ranald* and *Marion* shipwrecks that lie just off the coast. There are quaint shops and plenty of meal options. Edithburgh is also a base for a pre-booked trip to Troubridge Island where the lighthouse still operates.



MARION BAY

Nestled in coastal scrubland, Marion Bay has long been known as a great base for holidaymakers, anglers and surfers looking to explore Dhilba Guuranda-Innes National Park and the foot of the peninsula. There's a sheltered swimming beach, surf beach, boat ramp and an inkstained jetty that's legendary for its big squid. Marion Bay is on the doorstep of some of the best beaches in Australia with a rich maritime history and a great place to truly get back to nature.

The protection from rough ocean conditions sees the area home to fishing and cray-fishing boats which

are active over the warmer months. There are few locations on Yorke Peninsula that can match the reputation of Marion Bay for deep-water fishing, and several charters operate in the area. The autumn mullet run is also a drawcard for beach anglers and popular fishing hotspot Butler's Beach is only 16 kilometres to the east. The unique Hillocks Drive camping and accommodation can also be found here.

Marion Bay has a general store for takeaway and grocery needs and the tavern is excellent. You'll find lots of accommodation options from holiday homes and units to a motel and caravan park; or try camping outdoors - there are plenty of campsites to choose from on the coast and in the National Park, but check if you need a permit before setting up camp. The visitor's centre is at the entrance of the park and a great source of information.



MINLATON

Minlaton was settled in the 1870s by farmers who found the conditions ideal for growing wheat, barley and sheep grazing. Today, this large and prosperous town features a playground, skate park and picnic area, and the main street has a variety of shops. Be sure to call in to Harvest Corner for local produce, quality crafts and visitor information; and craft brewery, Watsacowie Brewing Company for a tasty ale and the Minlaton Caravan Park is located nearby for accommodation. If you

need to park your van, there is room on Fourth Street – the ideal place to embark on a journey down the main street.

Minlagawi Gum Flat Reserve, east of the town is a great spot for a picnic. There is a picturesque walking trail which includes Yorke Peninsula's only red aum stand. Aboriginal wells and a she-oak forest.

The kids will love the fauna park with its inquisitive kangaroos and emus. Nearby is a memorial to Captain Harry Butler, who in 1919 flew his World War I Bristol monoplane Red Devil on the first special mail delivery in the Southern Hemisphere across the sea to Minlaton from Adelaide. Believed to be the only genuine Bristol monoplane left in the world, it has been restored to its original condition. Harry's statue stands nearby, testament to Minlaton's most famous son.



POINT TURTON

Point Turton overlooks the white sandy beaches of Hardwicke Bay where the peninsula's 'leg' meets its 'foot'. The sheltered waters are perfect for yearround boating, fishing and sailing.

Point Turton offers a lower Spencer Gulf sunset that is hard to ignore. There is also a good range of services including a swimming centre, nature playground, General Store and a caravan park overlooking the jetty.

PORT VINCENT

Port Vincent is a popular holiday destination and an ideal location for all water pursuits. Fishing, boating, sailing, swimming and snorkelling are all enjoyed here and the Town Beach is perfect for families. The marina offers an all-tide boat ramp. Kids will love swimming out to the pontoon from the main beach and wandering along the wharf to see what the locals catch.

Cliff top lookouts and walking trails offer great views across the bay and you can work up a thirst before heading into the shopping strip. The main street is a great place to browse the various shops and you can stop for a bite to eat at the café, kiosk or hotel whilst taking in the sea views.

Port Vincent offers accommodation to suit every need; caravan parks, cabins, apartments, holiday homes, a motel, a villa, glamping and more.



STANSBURY

On the pristine sheltered waters of Oyster Bay, Stansbury attracts swimmers, water-skiers, sailors and windsurfers. It is popular with anglers and provides easy access to deeper water. Attractions include the local museum and the bustling Stansbury Seaside Markets held on the foreshore from October to March. You can also pop into the Visitor's Centre for some local knowledge on what to see in the area.

Crabbers know this is the place to go for Blue Swimmer crabs, which inhabit the shallows in warmer months. Rakes and other crabbing equipment can be purchased in town and you will see people dotting the water hoping to catch a feed.

There's an excellent walking trail where black swans can be seen gracing the town's back beach, and the Mill's Gully picnic spot offers a lookout with gulf views. The beachfront caravan park offers magnificent views to wake up to.

Local oyster farms supply fresh oysters straight from the sea (when in season), so keep your eye out for the signs. Other fresh seafood outlets are in town as well. You can also join the oyster crew on guided tours with 'Deckie for a Day'.



A service centre for the surrounding area. Warooka is a great stop-off when travelling to or from Dhilba Guuranda-Innes National Park. It looks south to the 'bottom end' and north along the coast from Hardwicke Bay around to Point Turton where you'll find white sandy beaches perfect for swimming and windsurfing. Buildings in Warooka date from the late 1800s and the Warooka Museum, formerly the police station, houses a comprehensive display of items originating from the surrounding area. Lower Yorke Seafood has local seafood for

sale, and is located only four kilometres west of Warooka



WOOL BAY

Named Wool Bay because it had a cutting in the cliff wide enough to roll a bale of wool down to the heach, this seaside town once served as a port for the district's farms and pastoral runs.

These days Wool Bay is a quiet gulf getaway, with Stansbury and Edithburgh on either side. Enjoy the relaxed and peaceful atmosphere of this small town or try your luck fishing or squidding from the jetty. On the cliff top you can see the remains of the lime kilns that were once common on this part of the peninsula.



YORKETOWN

The retail centre for surrounding areas. Yorketown is at the junction of five roads. It's the perfect spot to stock up on groceries in the well provisioned Yorketown Foodland.

Surrounded by about 200 salt lakes, which were once harvested for their salt, today the salt crystal formations and pink lakes are a drawcard for photographers. Follow the complete circuit of the Salt Lake Trail, starting and finishing in Yorketown. This driving route takes you past some of the best and most accessible salt lakes on Southern Yorke Peninsula. Interpretative signage highlighting the history of salt production in the area can be found at stops along the trail at Lake Fowler, Dhalliwanggu – Lake Sunday and Pink Lake. Sunrise and sunset offer excellent photographic opportunities as the sun's rays reflect on the surface of the lake, creating prisms of colour ranging from pink and orange, to silver and white.

Yorketown's old courthouse holds over 1000 photographs and there is a town walk for visitors. Yorketown is a good spot to stop for something to eat. It's home to a supermarket, liquor stores, fuel, banking and good shopping. The town's caravan park, which skirts the Yorketown Oval, offers accommodation.





By road

BYO a vehicle (or hire one in Adelaide), but either way, driving through Yorke Peninsula is a wonderful experience with views of the ocean and stretches of farming land to keep you company. Follow National Highway One from Adelaide to Port Wakefield. At Federation Corner, you can choose to turn south along the coast or continue straight on to reach the Copper Coast in around 30 minutes. Towns and attractions are close to one another, so travel at your own pace and stop to take in the sights, or follow one of our self-drive itineraries in this guide. There are fuel stations in most towns, just remember some close in early evening.

By coach

Yorke Peninsula Coaches operate regular services from Adelaide Central Bus Station on Franklin Street to various towns throughout Yorke Peninsula. There are limited bus services or transport options between towns on Yorke Peninsula

Cycling

There is no better way to enjoy Yorke Peninsula's diverse landscapes than by bike. The Walk the Yorke leisure trail offers shared cycling/walking trails around the coastline, and the sealed Rail Trail connects the towns of Kadina and Wallaroo following the old railway line. There are shelters and interpretive signs along both the Walk the Yorke and Rail Trails. The Copper Coast Visitor Information Centre offers free bike hire to visitors and many caravan parks also offer bike hire to their patrons or call in and see the experts at Copper Trails Bike Hire in Kadina.

Spencer Gulf Searoad

Take a break and take a ferry! Spencer Gulf Searoad travels daily between Wallaroo and Lucky Bay on Eyre Peninsula. Café facilities can be found on board *Aurora V* and at the Lucky Bay terminal. The ferry can take you and your vehicle or just you and bookings can be made online. Either way you can sit back, relax and admire the ultimate gulf views.

Mapping it out - The Coastal Way

Yorke Peninsula has a spectacular and interesting history waiting to be explored. Download a Coastal Way map from yorkepeninsula.com.au or collect one from Visitor Information providers around South Australia and follow the Coastal Way road trip signs to discover Yorke Peninsula's key experiences. The road trip starts from Port Wakefield down to Ardrossan through Stansbury to Dhilba Guuranda-Innes National Park, then north to Moonta, Kadina and Wallaroo finishing at Port Broughton. Allow at least four to five days to really experience everything Yorke Peninsula has to offer.






Fire danger

During Fire Danger Season, generally from November to April, there are strict conditions for lighting any fires, including campfires. On Total Fire Ban days, all fires are banned. Avoid severe penalties by checking cfs.sa.gov.au before lighting any fires.

Visit cfs.sa.gov.au and subscribe to bushfire warnings and other important information and check the CFS Facebook page to stay informed. Monitor the daily weather forecast and Fire Danger Ratings, know your Bushfire Safer Place, and listen for warning messages and updates on your local AM radio station. Further bushfire safety information is available by contacting the Bushfire Information Hotline on 1800 362 361 (TTY 13 36 77) or visiting cfs.sa.gov.au

Do not bring any fresh fruit or fruiting vegetables into the region unless you have an itemised receipt from a South Australian retail outlet showing it was purchased from outside a current fruit fly outbreak or suspension area.


